

JOURNEYS OF PAUL IN TURKEY

Oct. 28 – Depart USA

Your adventure begins as you board your international flight for Istanbul.

Oct. 29 – Arrive in Turkey

You will be met by our airport representative. Transfer to your hotel for dinner and overnight.

Oct. 30 – Istanbul

The bejeweled capital of Istanbul sits between two continents and is home to 450 mosques. You'll visit the famous Blue Mosque, with its six minarets and sparkling interior. You'll visit the Topkapi Palace, once home to royal Sultans. Inside, you'll see the fabled jewels of the Treasury, delicate displays of Chinese porcelain in the Kitchen Quarters and the provocative Harem Quarters. Walk through St. Sophia (Hagia Sophia) which, for 1000 years, was the largest church in Christendom. Built by Justinian (532-537 AD), the church has 107 columns, fossil imbedded white marble floors and beautiful glass mosaics. Today, it is the Museum of Byzantine Art. Catch a whiff of cinnamon, cloves, thyme and other exotic spices as you explore the Grand Bazaar. Over 4000 shops sell everything from herbs to gold. Fly to Cappadocia for dinner and overnight.

Oct. 31 – Cappadocia

Enjoy the day at Cappadocia, where amazing cone-shaped rock formations create a fairy-tale landscape. Pre-historic farmers were attracted by the remarkably fertile white soil. Because the stone hardens when exposed to air, generations have carved dwellings in the soft rock faces. As you explore, you will discover that, even today, people make their homes in the cliffs and rock cones of Cappadocia. It is estimated that over 3000 rock churches exist in the region. You will visit the Rock Chapels of Goreme, the Cave Village of Avcilar, and the Monastic Complex of Zelve.

Nov. 1 – Derbe, Lystra and Iconium

Derbe was 30 miles southeast of Lystra and the most easterly city visited by Paul and Barnabas. Here the apostles preached the gospel and "made many disciples." One of their converts was name Gaius, the same who accompanied Paul on his last journey to Asia (Acts 20:4). Lystra was the home of Timothy who joined Paul on his second missionary journey. Paul visited Lystra on three or four occasions (Acts 14:6-21; 16:1). Here Paul healed a man who was born a cripple (Acts 14:8-11) and ordained church elders (Acts 14:21, 23). But Paul probably remembered this city as the place where he was stoned and left for dead (Acts 14:19-20). Paul visited Iconium on his journeys (Acts 14:1-7, 21). The city was a learning center. Check into your Konya Hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 2 – Antioch of Pisidia and Hierapolis

In Antioch of Pisidia, Paul preached his first recorded sermon (Acts 13:14-52). While his speech was well received, he ran into opposition from some in Lystra. He and Barnabas were forced out of town. As a result, they symbolically "shook off the dust from their feet" and left (Acts 13:40-1). Hierapolis is blessed by hot mineral springs and some of the best preserved Roman ruins in Asia Minor. Christianity came to Hierapolis via Paul (Colossians 4:13). The ruins cover more than a mile. You'll see the impressive amphitheatre with seats still in perfect condition. You'll see the City Gates, column-lined streets and arches which have stood through time and earthquake. Today, the area is known as Pamukkale, meaning "Cotton Castle". It is named for the limestone-laden hot springs which cascade from one white-edged terrace pool to the next. Check into your Hierapolis area hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 3 – Colossae, Aphrodisias and Laodicea

Famous as the receiver of Paul's Letter to the Colossians, the town of Colossae has fallen into obscurity. While you can still see traces of the Theatre, the Necropolis and the Church, the ancient city is mostly indistinguishable ruins. Not far away is Aphrodisias, another town whose fame has been obscured by time. This city of marble thrived as the major center for worship of the Goddess Aphrodite until 500 years after Christ. The Christians of Laodicea, one of the Seven Churches (Rev 3:14-22), were chastised for being lukewarm, "You are neither cold nor hot" (Rev. 3:14) and for being too comfortable incorporating pagan and Christian beliefs. In the famous scripture from Revelation (3:20-21), Jesus says to the Laodicean church: "Behold, I stand at the door and knock..." Today, there are many acres of ruins to see, including the stadium and columned streets. Check into your Kusadasi hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 4 – Ephesus and Miletus

Ephesus is one of the Seven Churches of Revelation (Rev. 1:11). In ancient days, Ephesus was a bustling port town of 250,000, graced with wide, colonnade-bordered streets. Today you will be impressed with the spectacular excavations of the major streets of ancient Ephesus. You'll view the Library and the huge Agora. The Temple of Artemis was declared one of the Seven Wonders of the World. Today, only a single column remains to mark the site. You'll visit the Basilica of St. John, traditional site of his grave. From the basilica, enjoy a commanding view of the area. Visit the archaeological site of Miletus (Acts 20:13-38). Paul and his companions traveled to Miletus via Mytilene, Chios and Samos. Once in Miletus, Paul delivered his touching farewell address to the elders of Ephesus and predicted his death. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight.



Itinerary continued...

Nov. 5 – Izmir, Thyatira (Akhisar), Sardis and Philadelphia

The third largest city in modern Turkey is Izmir, long a center for Jewish and Christian communities. In Paul's day, the town was known as Smyrna. It was one of the Seven Churches of Revelation (Rev. 2:8-11). You'll see the Agora, the colonnaded commercial center where Roman statues can still be seen. Thyatira was once a busy trading center and famous as a "seller of purple". Today it is famous for Persian rugs. Thyatira is one of the Seven Churches (Rev. 1:11; 2:18-29) and Paul may have visited the town during his missionary journeys (Acts 19:10). Sardis, another of the Seven Churches of Revelation, was berated by John the Prophet for its facade of strength when, in reality, it was weak (Rev. 3:1-6). In Sardis, coins were minted and the dyeing of wool originated. You'll be impressed by the massive scale of the Temple of Artemis and by the white marble Royal Road, the gymnasium and the synagogue. Philadelphia is also one of the Seven Churches of Revelation (Rev. 3:7-13) and is referred to as the "New Jerusalem". Today, not much is left to mark the spot. You'll see an ancient wall and the remains of a Byzantine basilica. Check into your Bergama area hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 6 – Pergamum (Bergama) and Troas

The most favored of the Seven Churches was Pergamum and the church was praised for its forbearance during hard times (Rev. 2:12-17). Rome executed the first Christians here. Towering 1000 feet above the town and commanding a spectacular panorama is the fabled Acropolis. As you pass through the Royal Gates, you will enter one of the great centers of classic Greek culture. You'll see the foundations of the Temple of Zeus, the Temple of Athena and the ruins of the Library which once held 200,000 parchment volumes. You'll also see the remains of the Temple of Trajan, the Grand Theatre, the Gymnasium, and the Health Center (Aesclepiion). Not far away is Troas. Here, on his second missionary journey, Paul had a vision in which he was called to Macedonia (Acts 16:8-13). Later, during his third journey, Paul spent a week in Troas preaching and resurrected Eutychus (Acts 20:6-12). Check into your Troy area hotel for dinner and overnight.

Nov. 7 – Troy (Truva) and Istanbul

In Troy, history is buried in myth and mud. Nine layers of the fabled city have been found. Homer's Iliad relates the legendary story of the Trojan war. Travel to Istanbul via a Ferry on the beautiful Dardanelles. Check into your Istanbul hotel for dinner and overnight.


