What are you going to do and say to your dad on this Father's Day? For some reason Father's Day does not have the same amazing flavor as Mother's Day. Only God knows why. I guess its because men are sometimes rough around the edges and are perceived as hard and not given to many emotional signs of affection. And I reckon that may be true to a great extent. 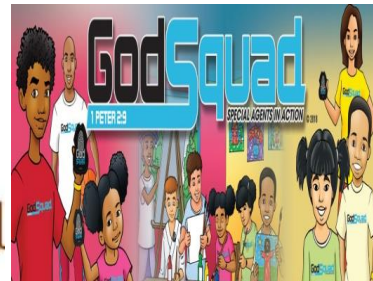

Personal Spiritual Inventory Reflection

Have you conducted a personal spiritual inventory lately? I have. First of all, I want to thank God for His grace and mercy in giving me the courage to be transparent. One of the most significant disciplines I observe each day is prayer. Not only are there two dedicated times in which I engage in prayer with as many as 50-60 people daily, but at various times throughout the day—with just me and God. I mention this purely to emphasize that I shudder to think what my life (and those for whom I/we pray) would look like without it. However, last week, I conducted a spiritual inventory, and this week I reflected upon it and found that I was ill—physically and mentally and spiritually.

In Kenneth Boa's book, *Faith Has Its Reasons*, the chapter on "Being and Doing" was very insightful for me. My spiritual inventory clearly shows that I am doing more than I am being. It shows me that I am engaged in several ministries, but not engaged in relationships. I am not practicing other spiritual disciplines as I should be, and therefore am not living up to my spiritual potential. While I may be feeling spiritually defunct or deficient, God is still blessing me and using me for His purposes. I do believe I could use a spiritual re-haul and refreshing to get my being and doing more in balance. While I have an active prayer life, I believe I need to improve in other areas of the spiritual disciplines as well as my relationship with Him, my time with Him in *lectio divino*. In my desire to do, I have neglected to take care of myself, and my physical body is not in alignment with my spiritual body, and there must be a balance if I am to be the effective leader God wants me to be. If you conducted a
